### Thought from Joy

Do you ever get the impression that something is trying to grab your attention? You see something: a quote; a flower; a style of vehicle; and you think, I have never noticed that before, then all of a sudden that quote, flower, car seems to be everywhere you look.

That has happened for me recently with the first chapter of the Bible, Genesis chapter 1. It is not that I have not seen it before, but all the meditations and Bible readings I usually follow keep bringing me back to it, especially to God's creation of humans, and the task he gives them to care for his creation, for all that he declared to be "Good."

Many translations of the Bible, including the King James version which was the only version that was widely read for about 300 years, use the word 'dominion', when speaking of how God gave us the task of caring for his creation. To have dominion over something or someone is to have care and authority over them, but it would seem that for some they have come to understand dominion as being able to subjugate that someone or something to their will.

When it comes to the world God created the effect of the abuse of humankind's dominion of the world is only too evident to us today. For I do not think any of us can be ignorant of the effects of climate change on our planet, (even if there are some who seem to want to deny any responsibility for it!)

Now I am not a climate scientist, nor an ecologist, but I cannot disregard the change in weather patterns we have all witnessed in our lifetime. 2025 has been declared the third hottest on record, and 2026 is forecast to be between 1.34°C and 1.58°C above the average for the pre-industrial period (1850-1900)

which will make it the fourth year in succession when temperatures will have reached at least 1.4°C above pre-industrial levels. (Figures provided by the Met Office).

This shows the disastrous effect of our previous attempts to have ‘dominion’ over creation, and we must therefore look at alternative understandings of dominion, that is to care for, to prioritise the needs of the planet and of all God’s creation, plants, animals and people, to find better ways of living that do not destroy the very world that we live in.

I do not know the best way to do this, I can only look at what I can do, to try and minimise my impact on God’s creation, because I want a world that is sustainable not just for me but for my children and grandchildren and the generations that follow them. Each of us are responsible for the choices we make. May we be those who care for all aspects of creation in the coming year. In the meantime, I remain grateful to those members of our churches eco-groups who continually bring these matters to our attention.

## Financial Update for Hilperton and Staverton Parish

As you know we ended the year with a deficit of £11,500. Chris and I have discussed the situation with the Diocesan Director of Finance and explained that despite increasing our church giving and fundraising we were unable to meet the full cost of our Parish Share for 2025. This was mostly as a result of the unforeseen heating repairs at St Michael's and likewise at St Mary Magdalen's plus kitchen roof repairs. Due to those costs, and the fact that our Parish has always paid its annual Parish Share in full in the past, the Diocese has kindly agreed to write off the outstanding amount of just over £12,000. We will, however, need to work towards raising the 2026 total due of £58,202. It will be a struggle together with all our other costs through the year but if we all commit to do our best no one can ask more.


